Summary

This report outlines the accessibility issues identified on the TicketForce web platform based on testing conducted on June 09, 2025. The audit was carried out using both automated tools and manual review techniques. The current state of the platform is **partially compliant** with WCAG 2.2 Level AA. The issues listed below are grouped by WCAG criteria and indicate the severity level for each.
